FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR

Fellow members welcome back to Moose Lodge 808. Our Lodge in the last six months has gone thru a trying experience with a kitchen fire, Covd-19 virus and being shut down for business by the State of Nevada. The Lodge will be going thru a soft opening in the month of June under Phase II and then we will have the official opening in July after Phase III is released by the Governor.

In some ways the kitchen fire in February was good thing for this Lodge. Here are the reasons that I believe the fire helped us.

- 1. The gas hose could have popped off the deep fat fryers at night instead of during the daytime, if that happened at night then we would not have a Lodge to go to because the **Lodge would have burned down**.
- 2. We would have never found the 10 electrical code violations in the ceiling which could have started a fire. Repaired
- 3. Found no GFI outlets by all the kitchen and bar sinks (Electrical Code Violation repaired)
- 4. ADA requirements not being adhere to in the parking lot (There are now).
- 5. New fire lane being identified by side and front entrances (Red 4" Line) There is now.
- 6. Repairs and Lodge maintenance like water damage ceiling tile in building from leaky roof, painting of existing door primer on exit doors, painting of fire damage walls, bathrooms and Conex box. These tasks have been neglected in the past.
- 7. Commercial shut off values installed on exterior propane tank and for each cooking unit in kitchen.
- 8. Master shut off value for propane into lodge.
- 9. The Lodge membership reach into their pockets for donation money to make repairs, so that the Lodge 808 will be Code compliance.

The Lodge will be having a Food Safety Class (Janice Nicholas, Instructor) for all new and old personnel that volunteer to help in the kitchen. The class will also be on OSHA compliance for kitchen personnel (OSHA Inspector) and Fire Safety compliance, what to do in case of a fire (Fire Dept Chief). This class will be required for all personnel that will be supervising or who are the chairperson for the volunteer kitchen help. A free lunch is being proposed for the students of this class and we plan on holding this class yearly.

The officers have made some remodeling changes to the Lodge in the Social Quarters. The ceiling has been lightened up just like an abstract Picasso painting. A second pool table has been donated to the Lodge so we can now have two pool teams on Sundays. The shuffleboard table has been moved so that a new league will be started and make use of this table. The gaming and liquor control board will allow any movement of gaming machines in a room without a new gaming layout plan. Persons under 21 must be at least 2 ft away from the gaming machines (Look at Terrible Herbst gas stations for an example of layout for underage children).

Food and Liquor costs will be going up because of distributor prices are going up and minimum wage will be increasing on July 1st (\$.75 per Hour) The board of officer's plan on keeping the Lodge prices competitive with other establishments in Pahrump.

The Lodge is going to continue the community service program of providing meat, paper and other products for its members at a discounted price but with one exception, the members will be able to sit and drink in our air conditioned Social Quarters waiting for their names to be called.

We have been reminder again by the Kitchen Manager that the NV Health Dept requires that all food that is being stored in the Lodge 808 refrigerator must be labeled with the dated and have the person's name that placed the food in the refrigerator. If food is placed in the refrigerator without a label it will be discarded in the trash. The board has found food that was labeled 10/21/2016 in the refrigerators. **Like they say some food can be tossed out**.

The Board of Officers of Lodge 808 can be reached at any time during the day if you have a new idea or a complaint that you would like to file.

The Lodge Officers would like to thank our 2019-2020 Governor Al Cook for his service this past year and we look forward to working with Bill Hansett who will serve as our Governor for 2020-2021. Remember the QUEEN OF HEARTS jackpot is \$5,823.00, so come on down Thursday, July 2 @ 7:00 PM and try to win the QUEEN.
