During this bimonthly newsletter reporting period, we collected a total of \$1,944.61 for our charitable giving.

Of this total, \$453.47 came from Bank on Our Kids, \$126.14 came from 9 o'clock ceremonies, and \$1,365 came from bingo.

On October 11, our Moose Riders activity group donated \$100 for each of the Rudolph 5K run/walk at Mooseheart and the hybrid car for driver education at Mooseheart.

On October 29, we distributed 200 Tommy Moose coloring books to children attending our Trunk or Treat event.

On November 5, we donated \$200 for the purchase of four cases of Tommy Moose dolls for St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital, the current California-Nevada Moose Association's Heart of the Community project.

On, November 14, our Moose Riders activity group donated the \$90 that it raised from the October Moose Olympics event for home furniture at Mooseheart, which at the time was at the top of Mooseheart's wish list.

At the time of this writing, we are preparing to distribute a \$750 gift to each of the eight local organizations that we gave to one year ago. Your participation in bingo and Queen of Hearts drawings made this possible.
