Why Do We Ask you to Show Your Membership Card?

I have walked into many Moose Lodges during my years as a member. Every time I have been proud to reach into my wallet to fulfill the experience of showing my membership card. Even though showing a Moose membership Card every time you enter a lodge or make a purchase says many positive things about a person, I know this requirements has been a big point of irritation among many Moose. "Fifteen years I've been a member here, why should I have to show my card every time I walk in the door?"

Consider this scenario: You walk into the Social Quarters on a busy Friday Afternoon, the door is opened for you by a polite, smiling young man that you don't recognize. The server recognizes you and knowing how much it irritates you, decides not to ask to see your card . You request and receive a beer. Then not wanting to offend the young man who held the door for you, the server draws a beer for him without asking for a card.

Then at the next month's meeting, this nightmare: Your Administrator holds an invoice for more than \$90,000.00 in back federal income taxes, interest and fees. The invoice had been presented to him that same day by the same smiling young man that stood next to you at the bar that Friday afternoon, He was the regional IRS Agent and you had been right next to him when he witnessed the lodge acting as a public accommodation.

This scenario has happened to more than one Moose Lodge. Their officers and longtime members didn't want to be "Bothered" with having to show their membership cards and they subsequently paid a substantial price.

Let's put the IRS and the income tax issue aside for a moment. Fraternal lodges, such as ours, enjoy a special rights as a private organization, including the right to choose who will associate with us. This does NOT mean we can discriminate on the basis of race, religion, etc. when choosing our members. However, we lose all the rights that a private organization enjoys if we don't conduct ourselves as a private organization. We cannot have it both ways. When a Lodge chooses not to check membership cards it opens itself up to the public (with the exception of Community Service Activities) and that puts the Lodge, and the entire Fraternity at risk of losing its right to operate under our own rules and losing the right to choose our new members.

Showing your card may be an inconvenience, but it is worth is to protect our Mooseheart kids and Moosehaven seniors entrusted to our care.

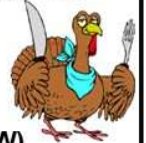

For those of you with your minds in the GUTTER

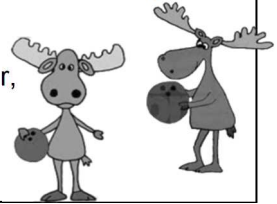

Moose Charities Update

4/10/22 – 6/6/22

During this bimonthly newsletter reporting period, we collected a total of \$3,873.32 for our charitable giving, indeed an outstanding two months of giving.

Of this total, \$367.11 came from Bank on Our Kids, \$139.21 came from 9 o'clock ceremonies, \$1,817 came from bingo, and \$1,550 came from generous individual donations from our members.

The \$1,550 from individual members' donations enabled us to pledge five cases of Tommy Moose dolls for the "Raining Tommy Moose" event during the San Diego Strike Force football game on June 18th. During halftime at the game, Tommy Moose dolls donated by fraternal units and individual members within the California-Nevada Moose Association were given to fans in the stands, who tossed them out to San Diego area first responders positioned on the field. The donations also enabled us to fund our \$500 commitment to Nevada Moose Legion #168's annual Tommy Moose drive for Pahrump and Las Vegas first responders. Finally, the donations enabled us to earmark the additional \$150 needed beyond the \$350 already pledged by the \$100 donation from the lodge and the \$250 donation from an individual donor to total \$500 for the March of Checks at this year's International Moose convention. The \$500 donation will result in special recognition of our lodge at the convention.

Thank you for your unending generosity. God bless our children at Mooseheart, our senior members at Moosehaven, our local community heroes, and each of you for supporting our Moose Fraternity's mission of caring for others and making me so proud to be a Moose.
