FROM THE OFFICE OF THE ADMINISTRATOR

New membership application activity in our lodge has decreased somewhat the last two months. Apparently, our lodge is not the only one within California and Nevada, as the Cal-Nev Moose Association membership committee has launched a membership incentive program Association-wide, in effect now through the end of the fraternal year, 4/30/23. Flyers detailing the program are posted on the rack next to the Center St. entry/exit door and in both restrooms. Please invite your family members, friends, and associates to join the greatest fraternity on earth.

I am often asked what the differences are between active members, expired members, dropped members, and terminated members.

An active member is one whose annual lodge membership dues of \$55 are paid. Dues expire on the last day of the month in which the member first joined and was enrolled into the fraternity. For example, if the member was enrolled on 9/2/17, his or her dues expire on September 30 each year.

An expired member is one who let his or her dues go unpaid by the dues expiration date. At that time, his or her membership is transitioned to expired status. The member then has up to one year to renew dues of \$55, at which time his or her membership will be transitioned back to active status.

After one year of being in expired status, the member is transitioned from expired status to dropped status. The member then has up to one year to either re-instate or re-enroll. To re-instate or re-enroll, the member must complete a new application for membership. To re-instate, the member must pay the \$20 application fee plus both the past year's dues and the current year's dues, a total of \$130. The member will then receive credit for the past year of service to the fraternity. To re-enroll, the member must pay the \$20 application fee plus the current year's dues of \$55, a total of \$75. The member will not receive credit for the past years of service to the fraternity. In either case, the member's new application for membership must be approved by lodge members during a general membership meeting.

After one year of being in dropped status, the member is transitioned to terminated status. Thereafter, the only way the member can re-join the fraternity is to complete a new application for membership and check mark the "New" box on the application, as if the member had never been a member of the fraternity. In other words, start all over. Pay the application fee of \$20 plus the first year's dues of \$55, a total of \$75. The new application for membership must be approved by lodge members during a general membership meeting.

An inactive member (expired, dropped, or terminated) is not permitted into the lodge – even if the inactive member is the spouse of an active member.



Bingo Update Moose Charities



8/9/22 - 10/10/22

During this bimonthly newsletter reporting period, we collected a total of \$2,004.73 for our charitable giving.

Of this total, \$478.59 came from Bank on Our Kids, \$183.14 came from 9 o'clock ceremonies, and \$1,343 came from bingo.

At the CNMA annual convention in Sparks, our lodge donated a case of Tommy Moose dolls and two \$50 Visa gift cards at the Heart of the Community desk. During the March of Checks, Lodge President Al Cook presented a \$100 check for incoming CNMA President Joe Henderson's special project at the time, which was the repair and replacement of motorized tricycles at Moosehaven. The goal for that project was met during the convention, so President Henderson announced his new special project - purchase of a hybrid car for driver education at Mooseheart, for which our lodge and our Moose Riders activity group donated \$100 each. Our Lodge and our activity group received certificates Riders appreciation for their donations of \$500 and respectively, for the Childhood Autism Program. Our lodge ranked eighth in giving to the CAP in the entire Association.
