

Bingo Update Moose Charities



Fraternal year 2020 - 2021 so far has been a mixed bag for our Moose Charities Bingo, thanks to the COVID-19 pandemic. It started out lousy, but has roared back way beyond my hope and expectations. We lost the entire month of May because the lodge was closed. June, we were allowed to re-open in time to play bingo on the last two of the five Mondays that month. In July, we played three of the four Mondays that month, as we were closed on July 13th. Since we were allowed to re-open operating as a restaurant rather than a bar, bingo has been fantastic, breaking records for both the number of players participating and the amount of money raised for Moose Charities. To recap: June - 27 players, \$164; July - 47 players, \$266; August through 8/10/20 (two Mondays with three to go) - 41 players, \$233. Both August Mondays shattered previous records for number of players and money raised. August 10th saw 23 players raise \$123 for Moose Charities. The coverall game payout that day also set a record of \$81.2020 - 2021 year-to-date - 115 players, \$653. Awesome, given all of the weeks that we have lost to the pandemic!In case you haven't heard, we are now playing bingo in the back room. players and I both love the change. Much more room, better lighting, and no ambient noise from other activities. We will play in the back room from now on. The lodge is now open at 11:00 on Mondays, so come join us for lunch and bingo.
